## **INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE**







## **FUND MANAGEMENT ANALYSIS**





- November was marked by the election of Donald Trump as President of the United States for the next 4 years, with the Republicans also gaining control of the Senate and the House of Representatives.
- On the central bankers' front, we can point to a second 25bp cut in the US key rate, despite inflation stagnating at +2.6% year-on-year and +3.3% for the underlying component of consumer price indices.
- Inflation also rose on the Old Continent to +2.3% in November, while underlying inflation remained anchored at +2.7%. On the other hand, economic publications clearly marked time, both in terms of leading indicators, with PMI indices contracting, and lagging indicators, with industrial production data down over the month
- Inflationary pressures are also back in the spotlight in Japan, with headline inflation rebounding to +2.6% year-on-year and core inflation rising to +2.2% from 1.8% as a result of recent wage increases.
- Despite an environment of strong growth and resurgent inflation, yields fell on both sides of the Atlantic this month, as did the US 10-year (-12bp) and the German 10-year (-30bp), notably following the election of Scott Bessent as the future US Treasury Secretary.



#### PERFORMANCE COMMENTARY

- The Fund delivered a positive performance in absolute terms in November, lagging behind its performance indicator, which benefited more from the easing of long-term interest rates.
- Our security selection once again made a positive contribution to the Fund's performance, particularly the main investment themes, such as financial bonds and the energy sector.
- We continue to benefit from the flow of new issuers on the primary credit market offering attractive valuations.
- Finally, we retain exposure to the collateralized loan obligation (CLO) segment, which is performing steadily.



#### **OUTLOOK AND INVESTMENT STRATEGY**

- We continue to focus on our core investment themes through a selection of high yield bonds, energy, financials and our CLO selection.
- In addition, in this volatile environment, we are maintaining our market hedging strategies at over 20%, in order to protect the portfolio against the risk of further market disruption, while focusing on alpha.
- Indeed, after years of weakness due to abundant liquidity and a low cost of capital, default rates should return to more normal levels, which we see as a catalyst that should create real idiosyncratic opportunities.
- Finally, the portfolio's high carry (over 6.6%) and attractive credit valuations should mitigate short-term volatility and help generate mediu
- to long-term returns.



## **GLOSSARY**

Active Management: An investment management approach where a manager aims to beat the market through research, analysis and their own judgement.

Bottom up investing: Investment based on analysis of individual companies, whereby that company's history, management, and potential are considered more important than general market or sector trends (as opposed to top down investing).

Credit cycle: A credit cycle describes the different phases of access to credit by borrowers. It alternates between periods of easily accessible funds to borrow due to low interest rates and periods of contraction where lending rules are more restrictive and interest rates are higher.

Forward financial instruments: A forward contract is a customized contract between two parties to buy or sell an asset at a specified price on a future date. A forward contract can be used for hedging or speculation, although its non-standardized nature makes it particularly apt for hedging. Unlike standard futures contracts, a forward contract can be customized to any commodity, amount and delivery date. A forward contract settlement can occur on a cash or delivery

High yield: A loan or bond rated below investment grade because of its higher default risk. The return on these securities is generally higher.

Investment grade: A loan or bond that rating agencies have rated AAA to BBB-, generally indicating relatively low default risk.

Net asset value: Price of all units (in an FCP) or shares (in a SICAV).

Non-benchmarked: Portfolio construction is a result of Fund manager views and market analysis with no bias to any benchmark.

SFDR Fund Classification: Sustainable Finance Disclosure Regulation (SFDR) 2019/2088. EU Act that requires asset managers to classify funds into categories, "Article 8" funds promote environmental and social characteristics, "Article 9" funds have sustainable investments as a measurable objective.
